Guilty of the Body and Blood of the Lord

Acts 4²⁷ for truly in this city there were gathered together against your holy servant Jesus, whom you anointed, both Herod and Pontius Pilate, along with the Gentiles and the peoples of Israel



How did Christ's death accomplish this?

Col. 2 ¹⁴ by canceling the record of debt that stood against us with its legal demands. This he set aside, nailing it to the cross. ¹⁵ He disarmed the rulers and authorities and put them to open shame, by triumphing over them in him.



Legal demands (*dogma*)

The basic meaning of the word is τὰ δεδογμένα (μοι), "what seems to be right." a. "opinion,"

Dogma

- the law of commandments expressed in ordinances (Eph. 2:15)
- the record of debt that stood against us with its legal demands (Col. 2:14)
- you submit to regulations (Col. 2:20)
- a decree went out from Caesar Augustus (Luke 2:2)
- the decrees of Caesar (Acts 17:7)
- for observance the decisions that had been reached (Acts 16:4)









The dividing wall of hostility

When enemies make peace



Luke 23¹⁰ The chief priests and the scribes stood by, vehemently accusing him. ¹¹ And Herod with his soldiers treated him with contempt and mocked him. Then, arraying him in splendid clothing, he sent him back to Pilate. ¹² And Herod and Pilate became friends with each other that very day, for before this they had been at enmity with each other.



How did Christ's death accomplish this?

Eph. 2 ¹⁵ by abolishing the law of commandments expressed in ordinances, that he might create in himself one new man in place of the two, so making peace, ¹⁶ and might reconcile us both to God in one body through the cross, thereby killing the hostility.

Col. 2¹⁹ ... holding fast to the Head, from whom the whole body, nourished and knit together through its joints and ligaments, grows with a growth that is from God.
