






#### JEROBOAM'S BORDER

## **ASSYRIA**

#### — That Bloody Empire —

In stature the Assyrians were of average modern European height and were well built. Their complexion was dark, the nose prominent, the hair, eyebrows, and beard thick and bushy. They were apparently of cheerful disposition, given to mirth and feasting, but of implacable cruelty. The pages of history are nowhere more bloody than in the records of their wars.




# JONAH FLEES
